

There is nothing better than a good cup of tea and that one of the most storied teas in Egypt was found in Aswan, in southern Egypt, at the Old Cataract Hotel, a British colonial hotel from 189. The Old Cataract Hotel is in a grand setting perched on a granite bluff overlooking the Nile. The historic luxurious property has retained its Victoria character and has played host to a variety of luminaries and dignitaries over the years including Winston Churchill. Agatha Christie, once a resident of the hotel, wrote *Death on the Nile* while sitting on the terrace.

The iconic property is surrounded by lush plants and palms and lovely landscaping including a giant fountain. While at the tea, you can sample different teas and flavors from around the world. The tea is composed of a three layer plate stand filled with goodies, including figure sandwiches, desserts and fruit. After your tea, be sure to check out the grand lobby with its historic furnishings, photos and pieces of art combining Egyptian and French influences.
